

NEWSLETTER 2024 HALF YEARLY MEETING – 1 NOVEMBER 2024

The Half-Yearly Meeting was held on Friday 1 November 2024, 1pm, at Gravesend Masonic Hall, (Ruckland House) 25 Wrotham Road, Gravesend DA11 0PA

The Chairman, Chief Executive, Elizabeth Woolman and all staff members welcomed 9 members in person. One member attended via zoom.



A presentation was given that covered the items listed below.

- Reminder of vision and mission and ASFS Strategic Pillars
- Strategy Update:
 - Brand Launch held on 24 October at Shorne Woods and attended by the Deputy Mayor,
 councillors from Gravesham Borough Council and charity representatives.
 - Final Logo Agreed
 - Member Forum
 - Two positive meetings held with good debates
 - Members include Philip Davies, Miroslav Gechev and Paul Woodward
 - Board members are Kim Harris, Elizabeth Woolman, Gez Gibbs and Paul Osborn.
 - Member Walk
 - Held on 17 September and well attended by members
 - Informative talks given on veteran trees and sculptures in the park.
 - No Board Changes 5 NED's and I Executive Director
 - No regulator issues but challenge received about the Business Plan and writing meaningful new business
 - Carbon offset with Carbon neutral will be renewed in 2025

2 Key objectives - New Business and Property.

Operational Updates

Two key objectives for the next few years:

- Meaningful growth of membership
 - Regulators expect the business to grow
- Lower carbon/higher efficiency property portfolio minimum EPC C rating
 - Climate change strategy in place
 - Property Portfolio accounts for the most carbon used and will be aligned to the Society's values over the next 10 years

Operational Journey

- 80% of claims received electronically (via the website that connects to the customer record management system, and email) helping to achieve a paperless office
- External local resource used where needed in order to support local businesses
- Member engagement maintained with a quarterly Newsletter, two members meetings per year and the Member Forum
- Ant Uttley appointed on a temporary contract to lead new business
- Growth of Members Starting Point
 - 33% of members live within the target demographic of Gravesham
 - 58% live within Kent
 - 70% live in Kent, Essex or Greater London
 - 30% live outside the South East with 2% living overseas
 - Over 300 members are over 71 years of age
 - Average age of members is 59
 - Female members account for 51% of the membership and males 49%
- Growth in Discretionary Benefit Claims
 - Discretionary benefit claims increased by 10% in volume over the same 9 month period in 2023 and 2024 and by 8% in costs
 - No staff increases as the investment in digital services helps to control costs
 - 79.1% of the membership have submitted a claim which is a great achievement
 - Females submit more discretionary claims than males
 - On 1 June 2024, two monthly payment runs were instigated reducing the maximum waiting time for reimbursement to 30 days.

Growth

- New website launched
- Two new versions of the sickness product to be launched one for £250 per week and a Group sickness policy
- Social Media moved to Fabrick
- Community support and involvement being enhanced with a 'Have Your Say' campaign that will be delivered to 25,000 doors within Gravesend asking residents to choose which organisation the Society will sponsor in 2025.
- Staff members have been constant throughout 2024.
- Strategy Plan Property

The aim to lower carbon/higher efficiency property portfolio to a minimum EPC C rating will be achieved by:

 Identifying properties to sell, keep and invest in. The Society has 110 properties and only one third meet the regulations

- Within the sell category, identify tenants willing to move
- Aspects such as flood plains, contaminated land and properties located close to forests for climate issues have been reviewed
- 40 properties identified to keep, 11 require more research, 13 regulated tenancies,
 26 properties to sell when the tenants move and 20 properties that require investment
- Two properties sold this year
- Low carbon, low maintenance properties in Gravesham being investigated
- The Board determined it does not want to spend 20% of a property's value to achieve an energy efficiency C rating
- Commercial property being reviewed to diversify the portfolio
- Rental income has to be maintained to support the business
- The new Government could bring regulation challenges.

The Future – Summary

- Products and Benefits two new products to be launched based on feedback from members
- Membership younger and more diverse membership to be targeted to allow the Society to grow
- o Investments the responsibly invested fund is performing well
- Community social media, sponsorship and partners will help to spread the name and work of the Society.

Member Forum – Philip Davies

Philip Davies introduced himself to the members and outlined the following:

- Joined the Member Forum to engage with members
- Two meetings held via zoom and discussions held on how to move forward
- He was keen to meet members in person or communicate by email or telephone and directly feedback member's opinions, ideas and suggestions to the Board
- Members were asked to contact the office with ideas
- More members needed to join the Member Forum.
